
I am pleased to submit the 1967 Agricultural Crop Report as required by Section 65.5 of the Agricultural Code.

The gross value of agricultural crops was \$69,324,000, a decrease of \$6,555,000 from the year 1966. The major part of this decrease is reflected in our pear production. Due to inclement weather our pear set was very poor.

It must be emphasized that this report reflects a gross return and in no way represents the actual profit to the producer.

I wish to express my appreciation for the cooperation and assistance of all individuals who contributed to this report and especially members of my staff and personnel of the Agricultural Extension Service.
